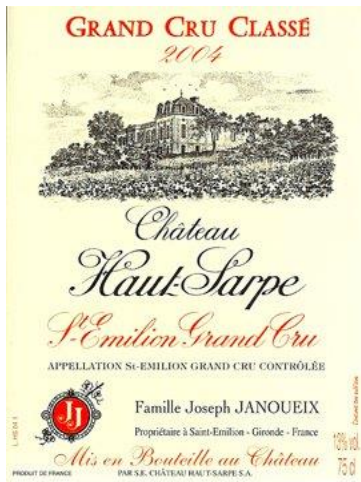

Saint-Emilion Grand Cru Classé

The family of Joseph Janoueix, owners of Château Haut-Sarpe, a Saint-Emilion Grand Cru Classé, is one of the great household names in Libourne area; they are as well known for making wine as for being wine merchants.

Awarded a gold medal at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1867, today the family keeps on achieving great results as back in the time of its first owner Baron Henri de Foussat. It was during this era that the Baron, encouraged by his success, undertook the renovation of the château and its gardens.

This edifice of great style, with its central pavilion inspired by the famous Trianon, has a wondrous appearance as of today - in keeping with the spirit of the Grand Cru Classé wine, very evocative of Saint-Emilion wine-making boom at the beginning of the 20th century – and in maintaining the same tradition as in the past with the children and grandchildren of Marie-Antoinette and Joseph Janoueix.
