

The family of Joseph Janoueix, owners of Château Haut-Sarpe, a Saint-Emilion Grand Cru Classé, is one of the great household names in Libourne area; they are as well known for making wine as for being wine merchants.

Awarded a gold medal at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1867, today the family keeps on achieving great results as back in the time of its first owner Baron Henri de Foussat. It was during this era that the Baron, encouraged by his success, undertook the renovation of the château and its gardens.
